- 1. Legislative Updates:
 - Representative Dan Frankel (D- Allegheny) and Nelson Napoleon (D -Montgomery) introduced a package of legislation that would expand and protect hate crime bills. There are a total of 4 bills that have been introduced:
 - HB1024 proposes providing Pennsylvania's law enforcement with the training they need to properly investigate, identify and report crimes of ethnic intimidation.

- HB1025 proposes training educators and school administrators to identify and address hate incidents before they become deadly.
- HB1026 proposes requiring, as a condition of probation or parole, an individual who is convicted of ethnic intimidation to perform community service or complete educational classes relating to the motivating factor of the underlying crime.
- HB1027 proposes strengthening Pennsylvania's "ethnic intimidation" criminal penalty language and step up civil penalties on those who target individuals or groups because of their race, color, religion, national origin, ancestry, sex, gender, gender identity, gender expression, sexual orientation, or disability of an individual or group of individuals.

Medicaid Work Rules in Debt Limit Bill Puts People With Disabilities at Risk

On April 26, the U.S. House of Representatives passed H.R. 2811, the Limit, Save, Grow Act of 2023, which includes radical new work rules for Medicaid enrollees in exchange for lifting the debt ceiling. Section 321 of the bill requires all Medicaid beneficiaries ages 19 to 55 to meet an 80-hour per month work-reporting requirement unless they can meet an exemption. Failing this test would cut off federal funds for that individual with states having the option of terminating coverage.

The legislation applies to all Medicaid pathways, including for those on Supplemental Security Income (SSI) and home and community-based services (HCBS) waivers. People with disabilities would need a doctor or other medical professional to deem them "physically or mentally unfit for employment" to be exempt from the work rules.

In a statement, <u>The Arc urged</u> Senators and the President to reject this extreme benefit test and other harmful cuts contained in the bill as they work towards a deal to lift the debt ceiling.
